# \$10 A Day Childcare

When the Ontario Government signs onto our federal early learning and childcare policy, we'll be saving Brampton families almost \$16,000 in childcare costs. We're making life more affordable for families as early as 2022 when we cut childcare costs in half.

#### **Vaccine Passports For Ontario and International Travel**

Thanks to the federal Government's quick funding, Ontario has been able to create and roll out a new proof of COVID-19 vaccination system. Download your new QR code proof of vaccination today and use it to access non-essential businesses.

The federal Government has also created a standardized proof of vaccination for domestic and international travel. You can down-load it from the Ontario website and add it to your ArriveCAN app.

### **USA Open To Travelers With Mixed Vaccines**


Fully vaccinated Canadians can now travel to the USA using our land border starting November 8, 2021. Canadians who received mixed vaccines are considered fully vaccinated, including any combination of Astra-Zeneca, Pfizer, and Moderna. Make sure to check Canada.ca for any travel advisories and travel requirements before planning your trip!





#### **Temporary Changes to Employment Insurance**

Coming into effect September 26, 2021 and ending on September 24, 2022, new changes to El include: uniform entrance requirement of 420 insurable hours of employment for El regular and special benefits, allowing claimants to receive El benefits sooner by simplifying rules, and ensuring that all insurable hours of employment count towards eligibility.
